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H&S Sentencing Guidelines Consultation

The Sentencing Council has a consultation document on health and safety offences, corporate manslaughter and food safety and hygiene offences. Inputs close in February. This proposes guidelines on sentences for such offences, based on factors such as the level of harm, culpability of the company and turnover of the company. The intention is to have more consistency. Whilst of course we don't welcome fines, SSS welcome the consistency of such fines.

One recent example was the Jaguar Land Rover case where JLR were fined £40,000 + costs after a maintenance electrician suffered major injuries when he was dragged into machinery. £40,000 is very low for a company the size of JLR and the above guidelines state that a fine of the order of £350,000 would be appropriate. Compare the fine with that in the BW Riddle case shown below in Incidents and Court Cases.

Workplace vehicle guidance

The HSE have published a Guide to Workplace Transport Safety. There is also a short version of this. Both a worthwhile documents and gave be downloaded free as a .pdf from the link shown below. In the majority of companies with whom we are associated, forklift trucks and similar vehicles pose the potential for the greatest harm and it is essential that appropriate measures are in place to reduce the risk.

Note that 2 of the Incidents and Court Cases shown below relate to accidents with vehicles in the workplace.

### **Lack of isolation causes injury when conveyor belt started up**

BW Riddle, a Lincolnshire metal recycling firm was fined £88,000 (inc. costs) after an employee fell from a conveyor belt when it started up.

### **Complete Utilities Ltd fined £107,000 after lorry driver crushed between container and vehicle**

Gloucester-based Complete Utilities Ltd was fined £107,000 (inc. costs) after an employee died from being crushed between a vehicle and container during a loading operation.
