SSS help to get Improvement Notice and FFI withdrawn

Following our submission of the objection via the client company, the HSE have withdrawn the improvement notice and fee. We can expect to see an increase in HSE intervention in a bid to gain more revenue and this case shows how this can be contested where the intervention is unwarranted.

Reminder to change HCFCs by end of this year

I thought I'd done this to death, but there are still people who don't realise that you must change refrigerant gases in air conditioners and chillers if they contain HCFCs. Modern units do not contain such gases. The most common HCFC is R22. You can see what the gas is from the label and the

Updates on fines

The changes which gave Magistrates Courts more power are beginning to show their effect. The average fine under the Health and Safety at Work Act rose from £11,000 to £12,000. Where other regulations are taken into account, then the average fine rose from £13,000 to £16,700.

So, if you are taken to court, you need to be expecting this kind of fine. The big advantage in the change is that fewer cases are being taken to higher courts, with the attendant costs and time delays which can be distressing.
